At the heart of this course is the MEND (Miami Emergency Neurological Deficit) exam which is conducted after the FAST test and reduces the chances of missing a stroke.

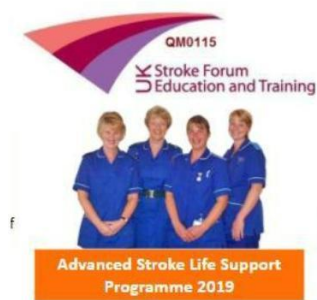
Our course was developed in conjunction with the University of Miami, and the NHS!

Our training certificates are endorsed by the UK Stroke Forum and the University of Miami.

The M.E.N.D. exam incorporates all three components of the Cincinnati Pre-hospital Stroke Scale (CPSS) (Speech, droop & drift) & eight additional components from NIHSS:

- Level of consciousness
- Visual Fields Commands
- Leg Motor Strength
- Limb ataxia
- Gaze
- Sensation
- Orientation

Course Content:

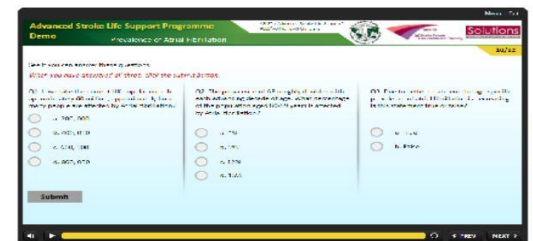
The course includes the following modules:
